## Review of Thoracis Trauma at Shree Birendra Hospital Chhauni, Kathmandu, Nepal

## **Abstract**

Nepal is going thorough war like situation due to insurgency since last few years and the hospital admission due to insurgency related trauma due to bullet injury and bomb blast injury has increased. This study will review the patients admitted with Thoracic Trauma during year 2002 at Shree Birendra Hospital, Chhauni. In the year 2002, 646 insurgency related trauma patients admitted in Birendra Hospital. Among 646 casualty patients 42 (6.6%) had thoracic injury with gunshot injury and bomb blast injury. Out of 42 Chest trauma patients 21 (50%) had penetrating bullet injury over the chest .17 (40%) had penetrating chest injury due to splinters from bomb blast injury, 4 (10%) had blunt chest injury. Out of 42 Chest trauma patients 19 (17%) presented with haemothorax, 5 (12%) patients had haemo pneomothorax and 6 (14%) had open pneumothorax. 12 (28%) patients presented with chest wall injury. There were 8 (19%) patient with diaphragmatic tear. Out of 42 patients 15 (35%) required thoracostomy. 15 (35%) required emergency thoracotomy and 12 (30%) required wound debridement foreign body removal. There was 1 (2.5%) death due to poly trauma
